Semester Dates

Autumn semesters : S5, S7, S9

Spring semesters: S6 (n/a), S8, S10

3rd year of study (Bachelor 3 level)

<u>Semester 5:</u> early Sept. –end of Jan.

Semester 6: end of Jan. – mid Jun. (n/a)

4th year of study (M1 level)

<u>Semester 7:</u> late Aug. –end of Dec.

<u>Semester 8:</u> early Jan. – end of Mar.

 Please note that for the academic year 2024/25, the spring semester of the 3rd year is not open.

 Students can still enroll for the autumn semester of the 3rd year and for both semesters of the 4th year.

5th year of study (M2 level)

Semester 9: early Sept. - mid Jan.



Program information

Year 3: All students follow exactly the same academic program for 30 ECTS. There are no optional courses except for second languages (including survival French). Courses are taught in French or in English.

Year 4: All students follow the core program, which includes a technical project (24 ECTS) and choose 1 major (6 ECTS). The only major taught in English is Software Engineering. Courses are taught in French or in English.

Year 5: Students choose 1 major (software engineering, the only one taught in English) and 1 minor. All students also undertake a senior project. Courses are only taught in French.

Please note that students can only select courses from the semester of the study year that they have chosen. Courses listed in one semester will only be offered in that semester. You cannot "mix and match" between semesters because there would be too much overlap in the timetables.



Nomination

- Study transcripts in English
- Proof of language level (B2 required in French or English depending on your programme)
- · Learning agreement
- Cover letter explaining your motivation to come to ESIEA
- Proof of health insurance for the period of study

Personal computer equipment

- able to connect to ESIEA's network and use all the resources made available by the IT department.

Tablets, mini PCs and Chromebooks are not allowed.

Student housing at the CROUS

ESIEA cooperates with the CROUS, a public organization that manages student halls of residence, and has reserved a limited quota of furnished CROUS rooms.

Reservations for the CROUS Accommodation should be done through ESIEA's International Office. Exchange students cannot apply directly. If you wish ESIEA to make reservations for you, please inform us no later than 6 weeks prior to arrival.



Rooms are assigned by CROUS according to availability. Due to the limited number of rooms available for exchange students, please note that submitting your application before the deadline does not guarantee you accommodation with the CROUS.

IMPORTANT: Please plan your arrival at a Paris airport between Monday and Friday, preferably in the morning, before 2pm. Check-ins and check-outs are not possible during the weekend at the CROUS.

How to apply to CROUS accommodation (Paris and Laval):

- 1. ESIEA's International Department nominates students applying for CROUS accommodation mid-July
- 2. The student applies online for CROUS accommodation on the MesServices.etudiant.gouv.fr website

How to check-in at Cachan & K-B

First, you have to notify the CROUS of your arrival date, and then they will send you a notification by e-mail confirming the date and time that you will have to arrive at the residence.

How to pay:





- 1. You will have to pay the security deposit online by **credit card** to finalise your application.
- 2. Upon arrival, you will have to pay the rent for the first month by credit card
- 3. The rent is paid monthly by credit card to the CROUS

<u>Documents required:</u>

- Identity document (and visa and/or residence permit if applicable);
- Certificate of enrolment or Admission letter from ESIEA;
- Guarantor: ESIEA will provide a letter;
- Student home and civil liability insurance

Insurance

All students must show proof of French housing insurance upon arrival to cover accidental damage caused by the tenant or by natural disasters: flooding, storm etc...

They also have to take out civil liability insurance which covers them in case of damage to a third person. This is generally included in the housing insurance, but this needs to be verified.

To take out a housing insurance policy, you can use any online provider, but you must use a French insurance company. Hereunder you will find two options:

- **HEYME**
- > ADH Assurance

The students will need to pay for 1 year of insurance (regardless of the length of stay)

Important: You should make sure that you have the <u>civil liability coverage</u>

We highly recommend you to open a bank account in France (see page 4 Visa and Administrative Procedures)

Public transportation

Paris and its surroundings

If you are under 26 and a student, you can get the **Carte Imagine R** card, valid for one year, for travel in the entire Paris Region (Île-de-France).

The Imagine R annual card costs €365, payable once or over 9 instalments, without any additional fees, +€8 administration fee.

To subscribe, pick up an application from a RATP station or apply online.

- > There are five start dates for the pass:
 - 1 September, 1 October, 1 November, 1 December or 1 January.

If you are under 26 and a student, you can get an Annual Abonnement Jeune on a TUL card for travel in Laval and its surroundings.


The Annual Abonnement costs 128€, payable once or over several instalments. To subscribe, pick up an application from a TUL station or apply online.

How to arrive to to ESIEA lvry-sur-Seine campus by metro



- Metro station : Pierre et Marie Curie

Direction : Mairie d'Ivry line 7Exit : 2. Avenue Maurice Thorez

Warning:

This line has two destinations:

Mairie d'Ivry, identified in yellow, and Villejuif Louis Aragon, identified in blue.

When you are on the platform waiting for the metro, you must ensure that you take the correct destination, Mairie d'Ivry, indicated:

- on the illuminated sign on the platform,
- on each car by yellow-lit signs.

Once you are on the train, the destination is announced by voice at the station before the junction.





There are many places in Paris and its surroundings you can visit as you please! You can check the <u>Paris Tourist Office website</u> to learn more about the city.

Here are some tips:

- Many museums are free for those under 26 such as the Louvre, l'Orangerie, Pompidou Center, quai Branly, Orsay, or the Arts et Métiers (don't forget your ID!)
- Street art can be seen on various districts like the 4th in the center of Paris, 13th, 11th, 19th, 20th, like a life-size exhibition!
- You can find some gaming bars in the center like the Reset bar or Le Dernier Bar avant la Fin du Monde at Châtelet
- The biggest parks of Paris are the Buttes-Chaumont (19th), Montsouris (13th) and Luxembourg (5th)
- There are castles accessible with the public transports like the castle of Versailles, Fontainebleau, Monte-Cristo, or Rambouillet (45 min to 2h of travel)
